


#### **HOPEWELL VALLEY** SENIOR FOUNDATION

#### **ON YOUR MARK**

On Your Mark, a Staten Island organization that has been serving children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities since 1979, received a \$20,000 grant from the Northfield Bank Foundation to support their programs.

## HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

The Northfield Bank Foundation awarded a \$25,000 grant to Habitat of Humanity for the construction of a new home to be built in Middlesex County, New Jersey for a family of four.


